Clemson University, a public land grant institution, invites applications for the Robert S. Campbell Chair in Technical Communication and Professor of English.

The successful candidate will provide leadership for Clemson's nationally recognized program in Writing Across the Curriculum. With a particular focus on engineering and science, the Campbell Chair collaborates with the R. Roy and Marnie Pearce Center for Professional Communication to continue and advance writing across the curriculum on campus and nationally.

The English Department seeks candidates with distinguished reputations in such areas as writing across the curriculum, professional and technical communication, rhetoric and composition, and digital communication. The Campbell Chair may participate in the department's established graduate and undergraduate degrees in writing and literature, including the M.A. in Professional Communication (MAPC), as well as the transdisciplinary Ph.D. in Rhetorics, Communication, and Information Design (RCID). Candidates should be able to demonstrate excellence in teaching, experience in programmatic leadership, as well as scholarship and publications commensurate with the rank of tenured full professor in English at Clemson.

Applications, including cover letter and c.v., should be mailed to Professor Lee Morrissey, Chair, Department of English, Clemson University, Clemson, SC 29634-0523. Review of candidates will begin October 16, 2009, and will continue until the position is filled. Women and minorities are especially encouraged to apply. Funding for these positions is contingent on budgetary approval from the Office of the Provost.
